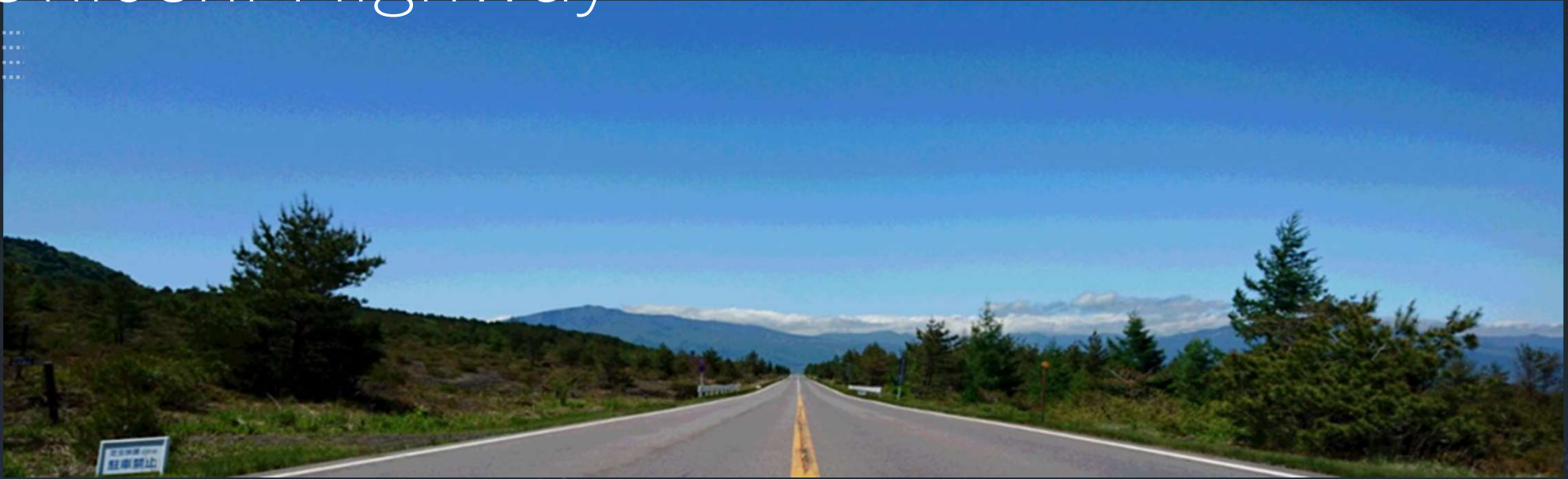


Onioshi Highway

The Onioshi Highway is a scenic toll road connecting Karuizawa in Nagano Prefecture with Tsumagoi Village in Gunma Prefecture. Stretching approximately 16 kilometers, the route runs along the foothills of Mount Asama, one of Japan's most active volcanoes. The highway is famous for its spectacular views of Mount Asama and the dramatic volcanic landscape formed by past eruptions. One of its main attractions is Onioshidashi Park, where visitors can explore unique lava rock formations and experience the power of nature up close.

Manza Highway

A mountain driving route with dramatic scenery and the scent of hot springs, climbing 1,000 meters in elevation. The Manza Highway is a winding mountain road that climbs approximately 1,000 meters in elevation in a single stretch. Starting in Tsumagoi Village, Agatsuma District, Gunma Prefecture, it passes along the slopes of Mt. Shirane and leads to Manza Onsen. This toll road is about 20 km long and offers a scenic driving experience through the mountains. The starting area around Mihara in Tsumagoi Village sits at an elevation of approximately 830 meters, while the area near the terminus at Manza Onsen reaches about 1,800 meters above sea level. The route to Manza Onsen is open year-round; however, during periods of snow or icy conditions, the use of winter tires (studded or studless snow tires) and tire chains is strongly recommended.
